45 X COMMUNITY MOBILIZERS (3 MONTH CONTRACT)

The Walvis Bay Corridor Group (WBCG) and Ministry of Health and Social Services (MHSS), in collaboration with the USAID-funded Data for Implementation (Data.FI) project, will be conducting the third Key Populations Integrated Bio-Behavioural Surveillance Survey in Namibia (KP IBBS3). The goal of the KP IBBS3 is to estimate the burden of HIV and HIV-related disease; assess health service utilization and progress towards reaching the 95-95-95 UNAIDS target; and estimate the population size of key populations. The study will collect data in five sites in Namibia: Engela, Katima Mulilo, Lüderitz, Walvis Bay/Swakopmund and Windhoek. The survey will be conducted using respondent driven sampling (RDS) methodology, to reach the intended populations.

- Fluency in local languages may be an asset.
- Commitment to promote inclusivity, equity and social justice.
- Experience in working with key populations is a definite advantage
- Must be a Namibian citizen, preferably based in the relevant survey site
- Fluent in English and local languages of the region is a distinct advantage.
